When a remarkable 425 persons responded to the Comprehensive Plan Survey last summer there were twenty categories ranging from important to very important. You ranked the Land Trust #2 (protecting the environment) and #3 (open space) as very important. That should lay to rest those doubters who may have questioned the positive affect a Trust has on the quality of life issues about which everyone is most concerned.

There are about 400 undeveloped lots remaining in the district. Given what we see daily in our community, can you imagine the impact of only half of that number being built on?

Bulky Cleanup Day Set for July 29

- Each household can place extra bulky trash curbside on that day. This includes furniture, mattresses, appliances (excluding freon units).
- Please, no refrigerators, freezers, dehumidifiers, a/c's, building materials, lumber, tires.
- Amount of bulky materials should be a "reasonable" amount.
- All bulky items should be placed out either the night before or by 6 a.m There will be only one pass per house. Please be timely.
- Anyone needing to dispose of freon appliances should call the office of Beck Rubbish Removal at 789-5900 for fees and scheduling.

The Trust has in place a plan to contact each undeveloped lot owner and present in detail the town of Narragansett requirements for the development of their property. In many cases where the lots are in a wetlands, some restrictions are so prohibitive that without sewers or other major considerations, it would be extremely difficult to build.

The most difficult parcels (about 125) are the first priority of the Trust in its efforts to persuade owners to donate their lots for philanthropic and/or tax purposes.

A brochure detailing the effects of open space and the impact of land donation on our community is being prepared. Former property owners Gary and Jan St. Peter have generously offered to contribute to the considerable cost of printing these materials. The St. Peters had recent dealings with the Land Trust and will appear at the July 19th Council meeting to relate their experience. At that time the Trust will make a presentation acknowledging their generosity. We urge all to attend.

I was attracted to serve on the Land Trust when I learned that then Chairman Marcel Fortin was spearheading an effort to reach out more aggressively to acquire land, rather than as in the past, just passively waiting for people to respond to the usual call for donations.

Though you may not have land to donate, funds are needed to support Trust activities. Most important however, is that you personally support and talk up the open space concept. The most damaging consequence would be any loss of momentum and commitment to this vision begun by Marcel.

I assure any potential donors that the Trust will hold all discussions regarding donations in the strictest confidence.

The Trust is losing two of its most outstanding members as a result of

our rule that an elected member may not serve two consecutive terms. Lee Listro served as more than a competent Secretary with her thorough knowledge of the workings of the Land Trust and commitment to its goals. Just about everyone in Bonnet is familiar with the longtime dedication of Cliff Hall to things "Bonnet". His savvy business sense and wise counsel will be sorely missed. Seek them out this summer and personally thank them for all they have done for you.

One doesn't have to be elected to serve the Trust. Give us a helping hand!

Bonnet Taxes-2000-2001

Bonnet Shores taxes are an investment in our property values. Over the past ten years, improvements have been made that have enhanced our quality of life as a beach community.

The largest budgeted expenses -accounting for nearly 50% of total expenditures -- are in the area of Public Works, including rubbish removal. The more costly projects that have been undertaken have yielded improvements to the boating area with the installation of a dock and handicapped accessibility to Kelly Beach. Beautification has transformed unsightly areas in the neighborhood to beautiful gardens such as at the entrance sign. All new signing around the District has helped make our roads safer.

During the past ten years the Bonnet Shores Fire District Council has been able to hold the tax rate at 1 mil while maintaining the same level of services to Bonnet residents by using cash reserve funds.

As you know with your own household budget, prices have increased. To be fiscally responsible in meeting our expenses we need

to increase taxes this year. The present budget is the result of several Council workshops, two public hearings and final passage by the Council. The Council oversees the upgrades and maintenance of BSFD properties owned by all taxpayers such as the pond, historical battery, Community Center, beaches and open space land. We all share in the maintenance costs of the common properties.

The Council has presented a responsible budget with a tax increase to 1.22 mils in 2001, representing the first mil rate increase in nearly ten years.

With this new mil rate, for instance, a property with an assessed value of \$150,000 would be taxed at \$183.00, or an increase of \$33.00. While it's difficult to raise taxes, the amount we pay in taxes is considerably less than the amount we would have to pay if we had to pay for our own trash removal, as the rest of the town does.

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Boating News

Mooring fees are due on June 30 this year. Any mooring not renewed by that date will be considered abandoned and made available to new applicants. All moorings MUST be marked with a float to insure that another mooring or boat is not set too close together.

If you have a mooring and have not set it up you must do so or it will be made available to the next person on the waiting list.

Presently, there are more than 40 boat owners on the waiting list.

There is now a \$20 fee to stay active on the mooring waiting list.

This fee must be paid by June 30, 2000.

For boat ramp access call Harbormaster Mike Tortolani at 789-8645. All calls must be made at least 24 hours in advance of the requested time. No calls are to be made before 8:00 a.m. or after 6:00 p.m. except in the case of an emergency.

Copies of the Long Rang Plan will be available at the annual meeting July 20. One copy per household will be distributed. There will be a reference copy available at the Community Center.

Recycling Reminder

Efforts to be environmentally-friendly continue in Bonnet Shores. Here are a few timely reminders which may help you sort household waste:

All recycling materials **MUST** be in a bin or open container at the curb. **DO NOT** put them in plastic bags. They will not be recycled if they are not in the proper containers.

Newspapers should be placed in brown paper bags or bundled with string. Again, do not place them in plastic bags. If they are placed in plastic bags, they will not be recycled!

 Glass, tin, soda bottles, milk bottles, cans and #1 and #2 plastics may be recycled. PLEASE RINSE ALL BOTTLES AND CANS!! They must be clean and free of food. (Check the bottom of your plastic container for the number in the triangle.)

• Extra recycling bins are available at the Community Center. Call the District Manager at 789-4540.

Adherence to these guidelines saves natural resources and helps reduce litter. Thanks for doing your part.
